Thanks to the 340B Program, Anne has witnessed countless examples of the positive impacts the program makes to her patient's health and daily living.

ANDREW

The retired police officer says he doesn't know if he'd still be around without the 340B program. He saves hundreds of dollars a month but has had to change his medications several times because of manufacturers withdrawing from the program. "The constant changes have made my diabetes harder to manage. If the program goes away altogether, I would have to quit getting my medications because I couldn't afford it."

DON

Thanks to 340B, Don's monthly insulin costs dropped more than \$1,100. He had to transition from one daily insulin to two when Eli Lilly stopped participating in 340B. Don is on a fixed income and was shocked at the savings he saw when he first learned about the program. "It was heavensent." Don says if the 340B program were eliminated, he'd have to decide between paying for his insulin and buying food.

TAKE ACTION

UnityPoint Health **SUPPORTS** efforts to ensure safety net hospitals and their patients benefit from the 340B program. This includes urging **HHS action on drug manufacturers** unlawfully restricting access to 340B- priced medications at contract pharmacies, maintaining the program as a **discount model, freezing DSH eligibility** during the pandemic, and **reversing Medicare Part B reimbursement cuts.**
