Subsidizing Services Targeting Vulnerable Populations

St. Luke's Hospital has served Cedar Rapids and East Central Iowa for more than 140 years. This includes offering services to at-risk populations that operate at a financial loss but are needed by our community.

340B savings are used in part to maintain these services:

- St. Luke's Dental Health Center. Since 1976, this clinic has provided safety-net dental health services primarily to children through age 18 from low-income families and for people with developmental disabilities. These individuals are typically uninsured or covered by Medicaid with limited community options for operative services and even basic preventative dental care.
- **Transport for Level III Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU).** St. Luke's Hospital is the only Level III Maternal and Neonatal Center in the Cedar Rapids area. As a regional service in Eastern Iowa, ambulance transport of our neonates between hospitals is vital to ensure appropriate care and family support. This transport entails specialized equipment and personnel and is necessary either when newborns require a higher level of care after delivery or after newborns receive higher level NICU care, are stabilized, and can return to a hospital local to their family to complete their hospitalization.
- Inpatient Hospice Unit. As one of few remaining in Iowa, St. Luke's Hospital hospice unit cared for over 300 patients and families in 2023 during the final days and weeks of their life. This hospital unit provides quality of life through a high-level of care and attention from nurses and physicians for patients requiring more intensive services.
- Inpatient Behavioral Health Services. St. Luke's Hospital maintains the largest inpatient behavioral health services in Iowa. Annually, 2,000+ patients are treated for severe mental health issues across three units, including adult, geriatric, and adolescent. This persists as an essential community need as behavioral health issues continue to rise.



St. Luke's uses **Contract Pharmacies** to enable patient access to affordable medications and support many patient programs. *Manufacturer restrictions on contract pharmacies threatens roughly \$300,000 from Linn County residents*. Savings that would have supported patient programs are instead retained by drug manufacturers.
