Expanding Access to Healthcare Services

Allen Hospital is the busiest hospital in the Cedar Valley. We care for more inpatients, outpatients, emergency patients, and cardiac patients than any other hospital in our 10-county service area. To efficiently use inpatient resources, 340B savings have been targeted to bolster community services to prevent avoidable hospitalizations.

340B savings are used in part to maintain these services:

- Walk-In Behavioral Health Clinic. This clinic supports mental health critical access needs in our community and is co-located at Allen Hospital. By providing the right level of care, this clinic helps to divert individuals seeking avoidable treatment from our Emergency Department and offers crisis counseling, medication prescribing, triage for emergent / critical behavioral health intervention, and community referrals.
- Community Cancer Services. Fighting cancer is a journey from diagnosis, through treatment, and into survivorship. For instance, our survivorship clinic addresses long-lasting or late-onset effects with the goal of decreasing cancer recurrence. Such services are team-based services and access may be hampered by lack of insurance coverage.
- Medication Management Clinics (MMCs). Medication management services have been expanded for individuals with chronic conditions, including diabetes, COPD, and hepatitis C. Through a patient-centered approach, pharmacists work with patients' primary care providers to help manage specific diseases. Patients with chronic conditions are also able to be seen more frequently often doses are adjusted every two weeks until health goals are met. Overall, these clinics are achieving results and improving quality of life quality of care is improved, time to achieve care goals is reduced, and patient satisfaction is heightened. Through the 340B program, low-income and uninsured clinic patients receive access to affordable medications, key to proactively managing their health goals.



Allen Hospital uses **Contract Pharmacies** to enable patient access to affordable medications and support many patient programs. *Manufacturer restrictions on contract pharmacies threatens more than \$1 million from Black Hawk County residents.* Savings that would have supported patient programs are instead retained by drug manufacturers.
